Best Performances

Boys Basketball

- Branford's Jake Palluzzi had himself quite the week as well. The freshman had a trio of three-pointers tallying 18 points in a 67-47 win over North Haven on Wednesday, February 24. 2021. He also had 17 against Cheshire and 14 against Guilford as the Hornets swept the week.;
- Sheehan's Kyron Coviello and Jack McDonnell led the way in a 57-52 road win at East Haven on Wednesday, February 24, 2021. They scored 23 and 22 points respectively as they combined for 45 of the Titans 57 points.;
- Career has a freshman to reckon with by the name of Thomas Glover. He scored 25 points in a 72-48 loss at Law on Friday, February 26, 2021.

Girls Basketball

- Branford's Lauren Thompson had 17 points in a 51-40 win over Guilford on Monday, February 22, 2021, and followed that up by making four three-pointers in a 20-point night in a 49-36 loss to North Haven on Friday, February 26, 2021.;
- Guilford's Faith O'Donnell scored 40 points in a pair of Grizzlies losses last week. This was highlighted by 24 points, including four three-pointers, in a 43-38 loss to Lyman Hall on Wednesday, February 24, 2021.

 2021. She placed first in three categories -vault, bar, and floor which led to her claiming the all-around leader for this meet. Catherine is the 20th 1000 point gymnast in Jonathan Law history.;
- Ella Esposito from Guilford was able to participate in a meet between Hand and Mercy on Friday, February 26, 2021. She took home third-place performances in the vault, bars, and beam.

- Kevin Stoddard had two goals to help lead Lyman Hall to a 3-2 win over city rival Sheehan on Saturday, February 27, 2021.

- Maya Bohan from the WH/SHA Coop team had a goal and two assists in a 5-3 win over Guilford on Monday, February 24, 2021. Both teams had entered the game unbeaten.;
- Avery Dayton recorded a hat trick as the Masuk-Barlow-Newtown-Lauralton-Shelton Coop team beat Hamden 5-1 on Thursday, February 25, 2021.;
- The goalies were the story of the game between Notre Dame (Fairfield)-Law-Foran-Weston-Pomperaug and the Coop team of Amity-North Haven-Cheshire. Bethany Karp and Ginny Currello made 36 and 39 saves respectively.

Boys Swimming

- Two stars shined in a meet between Hamden and Shelton on Thursday, February 25, 2021. Hamden's Nick Bennett won three events, while Shelton's Carson Rhodes and Korey Barber won four events for the Gaels. Hamden won the virtual meet 98-70.;
- Xavier defeated Cheshire 93-77 in a virtual meet on Friday, February 26, 2021. The Falcons were led by Noah San Vicente and Mitchell Wollen, both of whom won three events.

Number 5 Lyman Hall's Tyler Voisine



Tyler Voisine tallied 57 points for the Lyman Hall boys basketball team as they won two of their three games this week. This included a 24-point outburst in a 49-37 win over Foran on Saturday, February 27, 2021.

Number 4 SHA's Rosa Rizzitelli



SHA's Rosa Rizzitelli helped the Sharks to a 3-0 week, highlighted by a 25-point night in a 63-30 win over Foran on Monday, February 24, 2021. She also had 14 points and 17 rebounds in a 56-34 win over West Haven.

Number 3 Lyman Hall's Brendan Reddington



Brendan Reddington made only 20 saves, some of the spectacular variety, to lead the Lyman Hall boys hockey team to a 3-2 win over city rival Sheehan. Reddington's performance was impressive because the Titans entered the game undefeated and had scored 33 goals in its first five games (6.6 goals per game).

Number 2 Cheshire's Justin Finkel



If you think a one-point swim victory is a close outcome, how about a 0.25 girls gymnastics win. Hand did just that in a virtual meet with Mercy, despite the heroics of Mercy's Tallulah Malz. She won the vault and bars outright, while tying for first in the floor exercise. Her scores allowed her to score 34.05 points to take the all-around crown.
