The SCC excelled in the Connecticut High School Football Alliance games that were scheduled with the South-West Conference and Eastern Connecticut Conference during the 2018 regular-season.

SCC teams went 21-11 (.656 winning percentage), including an 8-4 record versus teams from the ECC; and 13-7 record versus teams from the SWC.

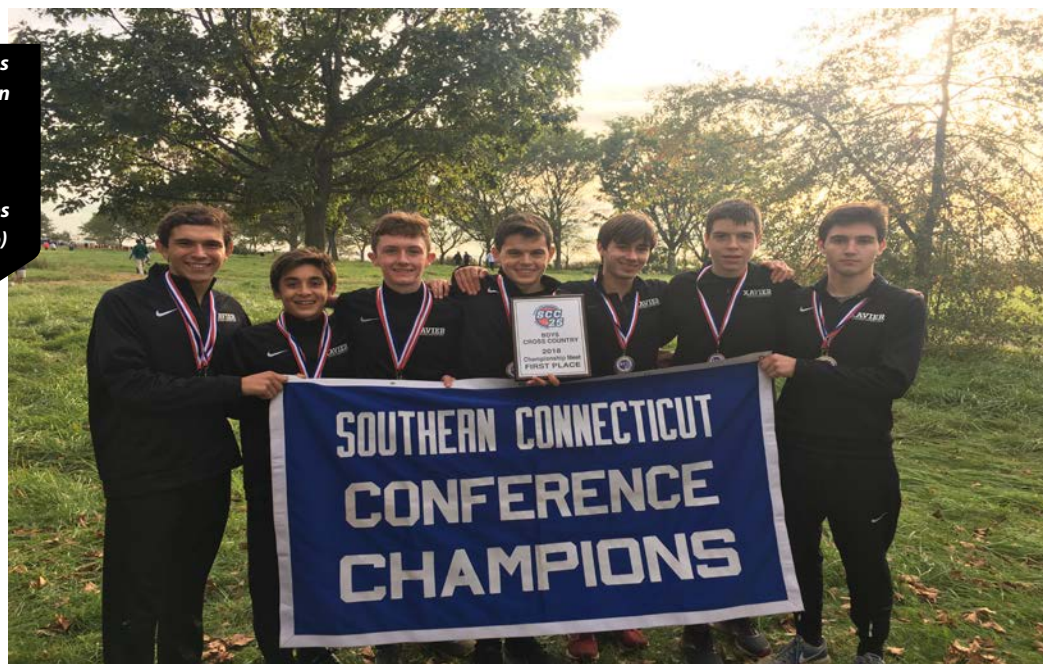
